# Basic facts about St Albans broken down by Ward

This report provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic and socio-economic make-up of the 20 wards in St Albans. It looks at the population structure and provides information on the economic, housing and educational achievement of each ward.

Other free reports include demographic and economic profiles of individual wards and health and wellbeing profiles which enable a side by side comparison of all ward(s) in St Albans.

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


# **Geography and population**

Here is a breakdown of St Albans giving the area, population size and gender split of each ward.

The total area of St Albans district is  $\underline{16,120.58}$  hectares. The ward with the largest area is Redbourn, representing 30.71% of the total area of all Wards in the district.

The most densely populated ward is St Peters with <u>70.75 persons per hectare</u>, the least densely populated ward is Redbourn with <u>1.29 persons per hectare</u>.



The total resident population of St Albans in 2019 was 148,452. By 2039 the population in St Albans is projected to be 177,653. The ward with the largest population is London Colney, representing 6.55% of the total population of all wards in St Albans.

### Age


This table gives a broad age breakdown by ward in St Albans. Harpenden East ward has the highest proportion of the population who are in the 0-15 age group, which represents 6.04% of the total population within the ward.

St Stephen ward has the highest number of people aged 65 and over representing 7.64% of the total population of the Ward.

This map shows numbers of households with dependent children for all Wards in St Albans.

London Colney is the ward with the highest number of households (1,336) with dependent children in the district and Sandridge is the ward with the lowest number of households with dependent children (611).

# **Ethnicity**

This table shows the ethnic mix of each ward in St Albans. London Colney ward has the highest number of Asian / Asian British residents in the ward.

Sopwell ward has the highest number of Black / African / Caribbean /Black British residents in St Albans.

# Housing


In 2011 there were  $\underline{56,140}$  households in St Albans and this chart shows the households of each ward in St Albans broken down by tenure. Sopwell ward has  $\underline{643}$  households rented from the council, which is the highest number for any ward in St Albans.

Batchwood ward has <u>330</u> households of other types of social renting, which is the highest number for any ward in St Albans.

# **Employment**

The Overall employment rate (aged 16-64) in St Albans was 78.3% in 2020 Q3 (12 months ending) compared to  $\underline{79.5\%}$  in Hertfordshire and  $\underline{78.1\%}$  in East of England.

Sopwell ward has the highest percentage of residents in St Albans who are claiming unemployment benefit. .


The bar chart below shows the percentage claiming unemployment benefit for each ward in St Albans against the average for the district.

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### **Education**




The 2011 Census recorded the educational achievement of residents; this chart shows the proportion of residents split by each ward reporting to have no qualifications.

Sopwell ward has the highest percentage of residents in St Albans who have no qualifications (18.52%) compared to 12.90% for St Albans as a whole.

Residents by educational qualifications (%) (Percentage of ONS population count) (2011) for Wards of St Albans (District)






### Health

This chart shows the general health of residents by each ward in St Albans, as selfreported in the last Census. St Stephen ward has the highest percentage of residents in St Albans who report they are in very bad health (1.5%).

NOTE: If the district of your report contains more than 30 wards the chart will show the 30 with the largest overall population.




The map shows the % of measured children in year 6 classified as obese for each MSOA in St Albans District for the 2017/18-19/20 (academic) year.
