STREET COLLECTION CONDITIONS

- (1) Applications will be invited annually and dates allocated for the forthcoming year. Priority will be given to the national collections of certain charities. All other applications will be considered on a first come first served basis for Saturdays. When all the Saturdays have been allocated organisations will be offered a weekday collection and placed in a rolling programme to receive priority for a Saturday collection in the following year (see (6) below).

For applications received during the year at least one month's notice will be required.

- (2) Charities are allowed to split their collections within the District so that they collect in different areas on different days. Subject to this rule no charity shall be allowed more than one monetary collection a year.
- (3) Permits will be granted in respect of all places to which the public have access subject to the availability of dates.
- (4) No more than one charity will be permitted to hold a collection within an area on the same date unless the charity which was first allocated that date and area consents.
- (5) An exemption on the street collection procedure may be granted to allow organisations to carry out collections in public areas which are not part of the street for a certain number of days a year providing they do not exceed a continuous period of 7 days.
- * (6) Street collections will be permitted to take place on Sundays, between the hours of 10.00am and 5.00pm only.

HOUSE TO HOUSE COLLECTION CONDITIONS

Applications will be invited annually and dates allocated for the forthcoming year. For applications received during the year at least one month's notice will be required so that where dates given to different charities coincide, the organisers can be notified in good time and liaise with each other to avoid confusion.
