District Schools in Bloom 2021!

St Albans City and District Council's Parks and Green Spaces Team are once again running the District Schools in Bloom competition for 2021! This is now in its 8th year, and we are really pleased to be running the competition in partnership with the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust, the Environment Agency, John O'Conner, Burston Garden Centre and Carpenters Nursery.

Why take part in District Schools in Bloom 2021?



District Schools in Bloom 2021 is aimed at schools within St Albans City and District that are delivering the KS1 and KS2 Curriculum. The competition will complement elements of the Curriculum and will support children with their learning and development.

The competition provides an opportunity for pupils to learn about the principles of gardening and to develop their gardening skills. All the categories in this competition are based on the theme of wildlife gardening. This will help pupils to understand the vital role that gardens play in providing habitats and refuge for nature and wildlife. These wildlife havens are essential, especially in the face of habitat loss and fragmentation in the wider landscape, and also as climate change becomes more evident.

District Schools in Bloom has been very successful over the last seven years, even despite the Covid-19 restrictions throughout 2020. It has been thoroughly enjoyed by all the children and teachers who have taken part.

How will the competition be run this year?

Unfortunately, we are still unable to run the full competition in its usual format due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. However, we are still keeping the competition going in the best way that we can. We feel that now, more than ever, it's so important to get children outdoors and engaging with nature. Not only will this help our wildlife, but it is also essential for health and well-being, especially during these unprecedented times.

we are once again asking for digital entries to be submitted (photos and / or photo collages). We'd be grateful if the photos, and also the final Sunflower measurements, could be collated and submitted to us by your school, by the deadline overleaf. Depending on Government regulations, we may be able to undertake a 'Mystery Shop' visit to your school at the beginning of July, to look at some of the entries and see how entrants are progressing! If this is possible, then we will be in contact later in the year to confirm dates / times.
