Standing deadwood is an important habitat for a range of wildlife and is left in place away from footpaths. Trees are monitored along the main footpaths around the common through tree safety surveys. Since the draft was published there has been a change to OPM management zones meaning that St Albans District is now within the 'established area'. Within this area the responsibility of management of OPM fall so the landowners. Therefore, OPM at Nomansland Common can now be manged on a risk-based approach where nests will only be dealt with where they pose a risk to the public.

We understand that this tree is a significant feature of the site because of its form and some damage has been caused due to climbing.
