3.0 PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONSTRAINTS

- The preliminary planning report identifies planning and environmental constraints and factors that affect the site and the surrounding area. The report finds that the main constraints and factors that have a bearing on the development potential of the site are:
 - The location of the site in the Green Belt.
 - The location of the site in an elevated position on the top of a plateau, which means that it is likely to be prominent to long distance views from the west.
 - A public footpath which crosses the site.
 - The relatively remote location of the site relative to shops and other services (except schools), which means that the location is likely to be viewed as unsustainable.
 - The unusually irregular shape of the western boundary of the site, which differs from that of other fields in the area. It also corresponds to a parish boundary and may therefore be of some historic interest.
- 3.2 In addition to these is the fact that the site is mainly a greenfield site and so would come further down the sequential order than previously developed land.
- 3.3 Following a further visit to the site and the surrounding area other factors that would affect the site include:
 - The need to retain existing trees and hedgerows in order to minimise impact on the countryside and the Green Belt.
 - The relatively narrow width and semi-rural character of Roundwood Lane. The Lane could not be widened without

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harming its character and involving the loss of trees and grass verges.
