Privacy Notice for Disabled Parking Bay Application

This privacy notice explains how St Albans City & District Council (the Data Controller) will use any personal information we collect about you when you use our services.

What information do we collect about you?

The information we will collect will vary depending on how you use the Council's Services. We collect personal information you agree to share with us voluntarily so that you can apply for a disabled persons parking bay. You will be asked to provide your contact details and documentation to prove that you are eligible for a disabled persons parking bay. We will collect some special category information about your health when you tell us about your disability.

We are using your personal information because you have given us your consent [Art.6(1)(a) and Art 9(2)(a)].

How will we use the information about you?

If you complete this form the information you provide will be used to enable you to be considered for a disabled persons parking bay. We will use your information for this purpose only.

We will not share the personal information we hold with any external organisations. We may be required to share your personal information with the Police, or similar agency, or another Council for the purposes of preventing and detecting fraud.

We will ensure that all personal information is kept securely.

How long will you keep this information?

We will destroy this personal information in accordance with our Disposal Schedules. This means we will securely destroy the information three years after you provided it.

Individuals' Rights

You have a right to request a copy of the personal information that we hold about you. If you would like a copy of some or all of your information, please contact<u>foi@stalbans.gov.uk</u> and ask for a subject access request. Or write to Regulatory Services, St Albans Council, St Peters Street, St Albans, AL1 3JE.

You have the following rights in respect of the information you have consented to share with us:

- To be forgotten i.e. your details will be deleted
- To have us correct an error
- To have us restrict the way we use the information
- To object to us using the information
- To have your information shared at your request (data portability)
