Cllr Allison Wren (District councillor)	Harpenden North and Rural ward	Wood End School (HNA)	The Boundary changes have increased the size of Harpenden North ward significantly, and added the village of Kinsbourne Green, at the north eastern most end of the ward. The furthest dwelling is at least 1.7 miles from Wood End school, which has been used as a polling station in the past. However, this did not happen in 2021 as the school felt that it could not guarantee social distancing. Whilst we cannot predict whether next year's elections will take place during a time of restricted movement, I feel that it is important that we provide a suitable alternative for the residents in the northern and eastern ends of the ward. During doorstep conversations before the elections, several elderly residents doubted their ability to get to the southern end of town to vote without assistance. Thank you for considering these important points.	As no suitable alternative venue can be located there are no proposed changes to the current arrangements.

I am writing to you in my capacity as a member of the Charrington Place RA Executive. Charrington Place sits in the corner of the ABD Polling District, and of St Peters Ward as a whole. It was our request as a Residents Association which led to Charrington Place and Station Way previously being moved from Polling District ABC and Polling Station ST ALBAN & ST STEPHEN INFANT SCHOOL, VANDA CRESCENT, ST ALBANS AL1 5EX to Polling Station TRINITY UNITED REFORMED CHURCH, BEACONSFIELD ROAD, ST ALBANS AL1 3RD in Polling District ABD As such, for Charrington Place to remain with the TRINITY UNITED REFORMED CHURCH Polling Station, we would support Charrington Place being in what will now be the SCP polling district, as provisionally proposed, and not being relocated to the SPD polling district that corresponds to the old ABC polling district.	
Trinity United Reformed Church is much closer to Charrington Place than	

St Alban & St Stephen Infant School.
We are just the other side of the
Victoria Street railway bridge from
Trinity United Reformed Church,
whereas St Alban & St Stephen Infant
School is at the other end of the
Polling District. Commuting residents
returning on fast services from
London can see Trinity
United Reformed Church as they exit
onto Ridgmont Road from City
Station. For commuters exiting onto
Station Way, it's a quick walk over the
bridge. Our closest supermarket
Iceland is directly across the road
from Trinity United Reformed Church,
with our two "locals", The Horn and
The Robin Hood, either side of
Iceland. We've had instances of
residents assuming that Trinity United
Reformed Church was their polling
station, only to discover otherwise on
election day itself.
The thing that takes Charrington
Place residents down to St Alban & St
Stephen Infant School - a much
smaller proportion of residents than
use one or more of City Station,
Iceland and the local pubs on a given
day - doesn't apply on an election day
itself, as the school is closed. Also,
while the desire line route there from
Charrington Place via the Alban Way
is in daylight for most - but not all - of

			 the day on a standard first Thursday of May election, it may be in darkness for peak morning and evening voting times for a by-election or snap general election. Our route to Trinity United Reformed Church is lit from prior to 7 am to after 10 pm. As such, and having consulted with the RA Exec, the preference remains Trinity United Reformed Church. 	
St Albans resident	St Stephen ward / Park Street ward	SSD	Polling Station for the residents of Spielplatz: For many years, as long as I have lived at Spielplatz our polling station was the church hall in Bricket Wood. A few years ago this was changed to the Scout Hut in How Wood. Although the Scout Hut was closer in a hypothetical direct line, it is much further away in reality as residents of Spielplatz have to go out our gate, into Lye Lane and then drive to How Wood. There was no sensible justification for this move, we are located in Bricket Wood and that's where our polling station should be. I did take this up with the council and my MP, who at the time was Ms Anne Main. I never received a reply. Now you are advising us that we should go to Park Street, even further	The LGBCE review placed all properties in Spielplatz in the St Stephen ward. The polling station for the proposed polling district (SSD) will be located at St Lukes Church, Bricket Wood.

away. This is totally unacceptable.
We should be going to the polling
station in West Riding, Bricket Wood. I
urge you to reconsider this decision.
