Local Economic Context

We are all living through, and adapting to, the current challenges:

- Escalating costs costs of borrowing, utilities, economic uncertainty
- Supply chain vulnerability
- Changes in spending habits
- Workforce supply





The District's Economic Context

Latest Census:

- Joint second lowest unemployment rate in the county and joint 57th lowest in England
- Property values relatively stable
- St Albans District has the highest number of business enterprises compared to other Districts/Boroughs in Hertfordshire
- 91% are 'micro' businesses, 7% 'small', 1% are 'medium', 1% 'large'
- 11% of population are self employed (national average is 9%)
- Creative sector is growing



The District's Economic Context

Latest Census:

- Despite our relative affluence, we have 7 neighbourhoods amongst the most deprived in the country
- Slower rate of population growth than the East of England average
- Only district in Hertfordshire that shows a decline in categories between 20 and 39 age ranges
- 17% increase in 65+age group
- Recruitment and retention challenges in a range of key services
- Importance of affordable housing supply
- Skills and partnership Oaklands College

- Continuing to work with the BID and other partners



LSIP is a government-funded programme designed to bring together businesses and education providers to discuss the skills needed now and for the future. The aim is to strengthen links and increase collaboration between businesses and education and training providers.




Who should get involved?

The information they supply will help identify the skills needs for our county for the short, medium and long-term.






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SADC AREA - 2021 CENSUS
