Much of the City Centre is closed to traffic for the free-to-attend event, called the St Albans Christmas Cracker.

The action starts at noon and continues until 6pm with the Christmas lights switched on around 5pm after a countdown. The event is organised by the Council with the support of St Albans BID.

Among the attractions will be dozens of food, drink and gift stalls,

Santa's grotto, street entertainers and funfair rides.

There will also be live music from some of the District's most talented musicians.

Another highlight of the festive season is the St Albans Christmas Charter Market.

This will launch on Thursday
1 December with the Market taking
place every Thursday and Friday
thereafter in the run-up to Christmas
Day as well as the usual Wednesdays
and Saturdays. There will be an
extra day's trading, too, on Sunday
18 December.

Timetable agreed for our new Local Plan

A timetable for producing a Local Plan for the District has been approved.

The Plan will identify land for future housing, commercial and infrastructure developments over 15 years.

It will also provide safeguards for the environment, enable adaptation to climate change and secure high-quality and accessible design.

Our schedule has a provisional date of December 2025 for the adoption of a new Local Plan.

Residents, community groups and businesses will be consulted throughout and their feedback will help shape the final proposals.

Healthy Start

If you are more than ten weeks pregnant or have a child under four, you could get help to buy healthy food and milk.

Those eligible will receive a Healthy Start card with credit worth £4.25 a week that you can use in some shops. Benefits are added every four weeks.

You can use the card to buy milk, formula milk, vegetables, fruit, pulses and vitamins.

A new service to help St Albans District residents improve the energy efficiency of their homes and reduce bills has been launched.

We have joined forces with the National Energy Foundation to create the St Albans Home Energy Support Service which provides households with information, advice and possible financial support.

You can call a free helpline and be put in touch with experts from the Foundation's Better Housing, Better Health (BHBH) team.

They can advise on how to save energy at home and whether you are eligible for funding to make energy efficiency enhancements to your home.

You may, for example, qualify for the Sustainable Warmth scheme which could get you up to £10,000 worth of free improvements.

Foodbank

St Albans and District Foodbank is helping to prevent anyone in our community from going hungry.

They can provide three days' worth of nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people in crisis.

The foodbank is part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by The Trussell Trust, which is working to combat poverty and hunger across the UK.

New Audit Chair

An Independent Chair of our important Audit Committee has been appointed.

He has held a number of senior positions in Local Government and in recent years has had a portfolio of other roles including the Chair of Rothamsted Research's Audit Committee.

His appointment follows a Council decision to improve the Committee's effectiveness and ensure it operates in line with best modern practices.

Experts from the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy conducted a review and recommended this change.

Climate Champions available for talks

Would your community group or business like to learn more about climate change, how to reduce emissions and help the District become carbon net zero by 2030?

Climate Champion volunteers were recruited from across the community to inform and encourage organisations throughout the District.

Twenty-eight new trees are to be planted in Rothamsted Park to further enhance the natural environment.

This follows the removal of 14 Lawson Cypress trees that were adversely affecting a nearby block of flats.

Those trees were twice the recommended height and the flats' developer has agreed to fund their replacement with a more appropriate beech hedge.

The 28 new trees, which will also be paid for by the developer, will be planted elsewhere in the park.





We have been supporting the Your Tree Your Future scheme which has 100,000 trees to give away to neighbourhoods across Hertfordshire.

The initiative offers residents the chance to claim free trees and help improve air quality, reduce the carbon in our atmosphere and enhance biodiversity.

Most of the 6,000-plus trees allotted to St Albans District for this year have already been claimed, although some might still be available.

However, thousands more will be available over the next three years with residents able to choose from eight different native species or a hedgerow pack.

Wood burning plea

Wood burning in open fires or stoves can produce more pollution than petrol-fuelled motor vehicles, recent studies have shown.

Residents across Hertfordshire are encouraged to use alternative heating sources such as electric or gas heaters and radiators. This is not only better for air quality, but better for people's health, too.

Huge interest in solar panel scheme

The St Albans Solar Together scheme was a success with more than 3,000 households registering an interest in acquiring solar panels.

The group buying scheme helps make savings through bulk purchases, finds the best suppliers and manages the installation.

Those who registered were sent a recommendation with no obligation to accept.





Use quieter fireworks!

Please think of others during the festive season and consider using quieter fireworks.

Research shows that the noise of fireworks can be a terrifying experience for dogs as they have highly sensitive hearing.

Cats, horses, farm animals and wildlife can also be upset by the noise. The RSPCA is running a campaign called **#BangOutOfOrder** that seeks to spread awareness of the issue.

Loud fireworks can also upset more vulnerable people. The National Autistic Society has warned the sudden noises can cause anxiety among some autistic people.

Quieter fireworks are widely available with many internet retailers stocking them.

We are also encouraging people and businesses to limit the use of fireworks to specific dates such as New Year's Eve rather than throughout the festive season, so people who are adversely impacted are not taken by surprise.



Protect yourself against flu

GPs and pharmacists have started giving seasonal flu vaccinations to safeguard people this winter.

Those in eligible groups are already being invited into their GP practice to have the jab or to make an appointment with a local pharmacy.

It is safe for flu and COVID-19 vaccinations to be given at the same time.

Getting vaccinated against flu and COVID-19 will provide protection for you and those around you for both these illnesses.

More people are likely to get the flu this winter than usual as fewer people will have built up immunity to it during the COVID-19 pandemic.

This year, the offer of the free flu vaccine has been widened to include more groups. The most vulnerable people are being offered protection first.


