

Personal Licences

Individuals who may be engaged in making and authorising the sale and supply of alcohol require a personal licence.

Applicants must:

- be 18 or over
- possess an accredited licensing qualification
- not have forfeited a personal licence within five years of their application
- pay the appropriate fee

The police may object if the applicant has a criminal record.

A personal licence remains valid until such time that it is surrendered or suspended or revoked or declared forfeit by the courts. Once granted the licensing authority which issued the licence remains the authority which must be notified of any changes even though the individual may move out of the area or take employment elsewhere.
