E-BILLING and easier ways to pay

From 1 April, a new service will be available for residents and businesses to view and manage their Council Tax and Business Rate accounts on-line. There will also be an option to receive paperless bills.

Details about this new service and how to register are available at: www.stalbans.gov.uk/onlineservices. You can also make payments like Council Tax online at www.stalbans.gov.uk, via your bank, at the Post Office, or at any shop showing the Pay Zone sign. There is also an automated payment line – call 0161 785 3880.

UC Universal Credit

From May, new benefit claimants in the District, who would otherwise be eligible for Job Seeker's Allowance, will be invited to apply for Universal Credit.

Universal Credit is a single payment to help people who are out of work or on a low income. It will be replacing a range of benefits for working age people, including Job

Seekers Allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit and Working Tax Credit / Child Tax Credit.

We are working closely with the Department for Work and Pensions to help manage this change.

Your Council Tax explained

St Albans City and District Council's element of the Council Tax is frozen for the seventh year running.

For every £1 you pay in Council Tax

Hertfordshire County Council gets **76p Total £67.9m**


St Albans City & District Council gets **11p Total £10m**

Hertfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner gets **10p Total £8.8m**

Parish Councils get **3p Total £2.3m**

On average, you pay just **£3.24 a week** for all the services provided by your District Council including:

- Refuse and recycling services
- Parks, play areas, leisure centres and sports activities
- Street cleaning
- Markets
- Tackling crime and nuisances like fly-tipping, noise and dog mess
- Special events and festivals
- Museums
- Elections
- Planning and building control
- Car parking and parking control
- Housing and benefit advice
- Sustainability initiatives
- Food, health and safety inspectors

The Council's funding comes from a number of sources including Council Tax. The Council's gross expenditure of £26.5m is the main determinant of the level of Council Tax, after allowing for expected income.

The actual charge for each band varies from area to area. This is because certain services are provided by the District Council in some areas, but by the Town or Parish Council in others.

registered, you may lose your right to have your say in who represents you.

Recycle your food waste, yoghurt pots and food trays!

 The results of recent research with over 7,000 residents shows that 98% say they use the recycling service all or most of the time.

However, the survey also revealed that there is low participation for recycling of some materials. For example, only 42% put yoghurt pots, and 38% microwave food trays, in their recycling boxes. Half of respondents do not recycle their food waste.

The research results are being used to help improve the service and help boost recycling to our target of



60%. Residents currently recycle around 50%, so we still have some way to go.

Thanks for all your efforts to recycle as much as possible. Food waste recycling is not yet available at communal flats. For all other households, however, please put your food waste in your green wheelie bin (or bag in some areas) to be composted. Some people use our small caddies before transferring their waste to their green bin. Other people put their large food caddies out to be emptied. Please use a caddy liner, or wrap the food

tightly in newspaper, paper bags or kitchen towel to keep your bin clean.

Currently, up to 90% of food waste is going to landfill. Food waste is heavy and expensive to send to landfill (nearly £100 a tonne), so a big effort with this will be a huge help.

You can order additional recycling boxes via our website. You can have up to five boxes for free. Extras cost £3 each. We will empty as many as you can fill! Please separate your waste as shown above and on page 8.
