## Increase in burglaries

Between October and December 2015 there were 97 burglaries in the District compared to 78 in the same period the year before. Police are asking residents to take the following precautions:

Secure your back garden lock your shed and gates (top and bottom) and mend any broken fences. Don't leave ladders and tools outside.

Lock all doors and windows and use timer switches on lamps and lights to give your home a lived-in look.

Take photos of prized possessions and register them at www.immobilise.com so they can be returned to you if stolen and recovered.

You could also join or start a Neighbourhood Watch scheme.

## Keeping it private on social media

If you are concerned about privacy, it's best not to post information on social media that allows strangers to contact you in real life.

Don't post your address, school, or phone number, for example.

Think about the future and don't upload anything that might embarrass you later, for instance when applying for jobs or college. Don't be pressured into taking pictures of yourself that you wouldn't want other people to see. Also remember that photos taken from many phones have embedded location information.

The Police & Crime Commissioner and District Council elections take place on Thursday 5 May 2016.

### For every £1 you pay in Council Tax

#### Charges, and why they vary between areas

St Albans City & District Council also collects Council Tax on behalf of Hertfordshire County Council, Hertfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner and the Town and Parish Councils in the District.

The actual charge for each band varies from area to area. This is because certain services are provided by the District Council in some areas, but by the Town or Parish Council in others.

# **GREEN ISSUES**

## Abuse of crews

Sadly, while most people treat waste, recycling and street cleaning crews with respect and dignity, there has been a rise in abusive behaviour.

We want to protect crews from abuse at work. This is why we will seek to involve the Police and



suspend waste collection services from individual properties if necessary.



The Council will collect as resources are limited and

much sorted recycling as you can put out for collection (for how to sort your recycling see www.stalbans.gov.uk/ wasteandrecycling).

However, we are only able to take the non-recyclable waste that fits in your black bin. We don't take away extra waste and black bags etc., put out for collection (except at Christmas). Most people understand the need to do this. We have to encourage as much recycling as possible, especially as natural resources are limited and landfill costs local taxpayers around £100 a tonne.

We offer a handy bulky waste collection service for large household items like fridges, washing machines, TV sets and other electrical goods. The cost of this service is £25.50 (including VAT) for up to 6 items. See www.stalbans.gov.uk/ wasteandrecycling for details.

You can also take additional waste and bulky items to the local Household Waste Recycling Centres (see **www.stalbans.gov.uk/hwrc**) free of charge.

## Food waste - make an impact!

Next time you're poised to put that tea bag, or those old potatoes, in the bin, please think again.

About a third of the District's refuse is currently food waste which is heavy and expensive to send to the tip. Each tonne is costing you and your neighbours almost £100 in landfill charges. Instead, please put your food scraps in your green bin with your garden waste, if you have this service, or in your home composter.

Later this year, we will be making it easier for you by introducing a weekly food waste collection. Thanks very much for all your efforts!

## Wildfowl and walls – help keep Verulamium special

If you go down to Verulamium Park, chances are you'll spot new signs, designed with help from local children, urging us not to feed the wildfowl.

Much as we all love feeding the ducks, doing so is proving harmful. Sadly, it's encouraging overcrowding and poor water quality, and discouraging natural migration. It can also also make the birds ill.

A school poster competition to highlight the issue attracted 354 entries from around the District. The "Keep Our Wildfowl Wild" winners were: Lily Crocker form Redbourn Infant and Nursery School, and Kieran Barrett, Tom Vick, Thomas Kelway, Esme Hall and Tomas Roffe, all at Bernards Heath Infant and Nursery School in St Albans.
