

NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER

Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Definitive Map and Statement of Public
Rights of Way in Hertfordshire

The Hertfordshire County Council (Park Wood, St Michael) Modification Order 2020

The above Order made on 22nd October 2020, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by:-

Adding to them A public footpath commencing at a junction with Ragged Hall Lane (public road) at TL 1242 0517 running north along the western edge of Park Wood for approximately 85 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 23 at TL 1243 0525. Continuing north for approximately 85 metres to TL 1241 0533, continuing east north east for approximately 105 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 22 at TL 1252 0534, continuing east north east for approximately 140 metres crossing St Michael Rural Footpath 20 at TL 1265 0538, continuing north east then east for approximately 290 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 21 at TL 1292 0546.

A public footpath commencing at a junction with Ragged Hall Lane (public road) and St Michael Rural Footpath 22 at TL 1267 0516 running north for approximately 120 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 23 at TL 1266 0528, continuing north for approximately 100 metres, crossing St Michael Rural Footpath 19 at TL 1265 0538, continuing north for 145 metres to TL 1263 0552, continuing east parallel to the northern boundary of Park Wood for approximately 300 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 21 at TL 1293 0554, continuing east for approximately 10 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 8 at TL 1295 0554.

A public footpath commencing at a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 20 at TL 1293 0554 running south for approximately 75 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 19 at TL 1292 0546, continuing south south east along the eastern boundary of Park Wood and parallel to St Michael Rural Footpath 8 for approximately 290 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 22 at TL 1283 0521.

A public footpath commencing at a junction with Ragged Hall Lane (Public Road) and St Michael Rural Footpath 8 at TL 1284 0520 running north west for approximately 20 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 21 at TL 1283 0521, then south west and west running along the southern boundary of Park Wood and parallel to Ragged Hall Lane for approximately 180 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 20 at TL 1267 0516, then west along the southern boundary of Park Wood for approximately 95 metres to TL 1257 0517, continuing north north west for approximately 100 metres crossing St Michael Rural Footpath 23 at TL 1254 0526, continuing north north west for approximately 85 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 19 at TL 1252 0534.

A public footpath commencing at a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 19 at TL 1243 0525 running east north east for approximately 115 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 22 at TL 1254 0526, continuing east north east for approximately 120 metres to a junction with St Michael Rural Footpath 20 at TL 1266 0528.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
