## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

### THE ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL (FROBISHER ROAD, ST ALBANS) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING AND WAITING ON VERGES AND FOOTWAYS) ORDER 2019

The St Albans City and District Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 19 of The Local Government Act 2000 and The Local Government (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2012 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under sections 1, 2, 3 and of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the provisions of Part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officers of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, makes the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and may be cited as The St Albans City And District Council (Frobisher Road, St Albans)(Prohibition of Stopping and Waiting on Verges and Footways) Order 2019 hereinafter referred to as "this Order";

#### Interpretations

2. In this order:-

"carriageway" has the meaning as given in the Highways Act 1980 but does not include lay-bys.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means an officer authorised by the Council to enforce the provisions of this Order;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" means the same as in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"footway" means any paved or hardened area separated from the highway carriageway for use by pedestrians.

"parking contravention" means the same as in the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"parking disc" means the same as in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Penalty Charge" means a penalty charge imposed under Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by the Council in respect of a Penalty Charge;

"relevant position" means the same as in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2011.

"verge" means any part of a road not being a carriageway and includes road margins, central reservations and those areas laid for ornamental purposes but does not include lay-bys.

### **Restrictions on Stopping and Waiting On Verge or Footway**

3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait at any time with two or more wheels on any part of the verge or footway in those lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

### **Exemptions to the provisions of this Order**

4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to –
  - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by St Albans City and District Council.
  - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
  - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
  - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;
- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are –
  - (a) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (b) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
  - (c) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
  - (d) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

### **Contraventions**

5. Where any person causes or permits a vehicle to stop or wait with two or more wheels on any part of the verge or footway in a length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order without complying with the provisions of this Order, a parking contravention shall be deemed to have occurred and a Penalty Charge Notice shall be payable.
6. Where a Civil Enforcement Officer has reason to believe that a parking contravention has occurred, he shall serve a Penalty Charge Notice in respect of the vehicle concerned.
8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

### THE ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL (FROBISHER ROAD, DRAKES DRIVE, HOWARD CLOSE and HILL END LANE, ST ALBANS) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2019

The St Albans City and District Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 19 of The Local Government Act 2000 and The Local Government (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2012 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under sections 1, 2, 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the provisions of Part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officers of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, makes the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and may be cited as The St Albans City And District Council (Frobisher Road, Drakes Drive, Howard Close and Hill End Lane, St Albans)(Restriction of Waiting) Order 2019 hereinafter referred to as “this Order”;

#### **Restrictions on waiting**

2. Save as provided in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order no person, except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer shall, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of road in St Albans as specified in the Schedule to this Order.

#### **Exemptions to the provisions of this Order**

3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as “the restricted area”) in relation to –
  - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by St Albans City and District Council.
  - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
  - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
  - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article -

The expressions “universal service provider”, “provision of a universal postal Service” and “postal packet” shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2011.

(2) The “purposes” referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are –

- (a) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (b) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
- (c) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
- (d) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

(3) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall not apply to those sections of Frobisher Road designated by the provisions The St Albans City and District Council (Frobisher Road, St Albans)(Verge Parking Place) Order 201\*

4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as “the restricted area”) so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary –
- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
  - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person’s vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

In this Article -

“disabled person’s vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

“disabled person’s badge” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

“parking disc” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and

“relevant position” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
8. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

5	Frobisher Road	Southwest	From a point in line with the northwestern kerbline of Howard Close northwestwards for a distance of 12 metres
6	Frobisher Road	Southwest	From a point in line with the southeastern kerbline of Howard Close southeastwards for a distance of 12 metres
7	Hill End Lane	Northwest	From a point in line with the northeastern kerbline of Frobisher Road northeastwards for a distance of 20 metres
8	Hill End Lane	Northwest	From a point in line with the southwestern kerbline of Frobisher Road southwestwards for a distance of 20 metres
9	Howard Close	Both	From its junction with Frobisher Road southwestwards for a distance of 10 metres

### THE ST ALBANS CITY AND DISTRICT COUNCIL (FROBISHER ROAD, ST ALBANS) (VERGE AND FOOTWAY PARKING PLACE) ORDER 2019

The St Albans City and District Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 19 of The Local Government Act 2000 and The Local Government (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2012 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under sections 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The St Albans City and District Council (Frobisher Road, St Albans)(Verge and Footway Parking Place) Order 2019 and shall come into effect on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

#### Interpretations

2. In this order:-

"carriageway" has the meaning as given in the Highways Act 1980 but does not include lay-bys.

"footway" means any paved or hardened area separated from the highway carriageway for use by pedestrians.

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136(1) of the Act of 1984;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by the Council in respect of a Penalty Charge;

"verge" means any part of a road not being a carriageway and includes road margins, central reservations and those areas laid for ornamental purposes but does not include lay-bys.

#### Designation of Parking Place

3. That length of Footway and Verge in Frobisher Road, as specified in the Schedule to this Order is hereby designated for use as a parking place for motor vehicles at any time.
4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the act of 1984 or by any other enactment.



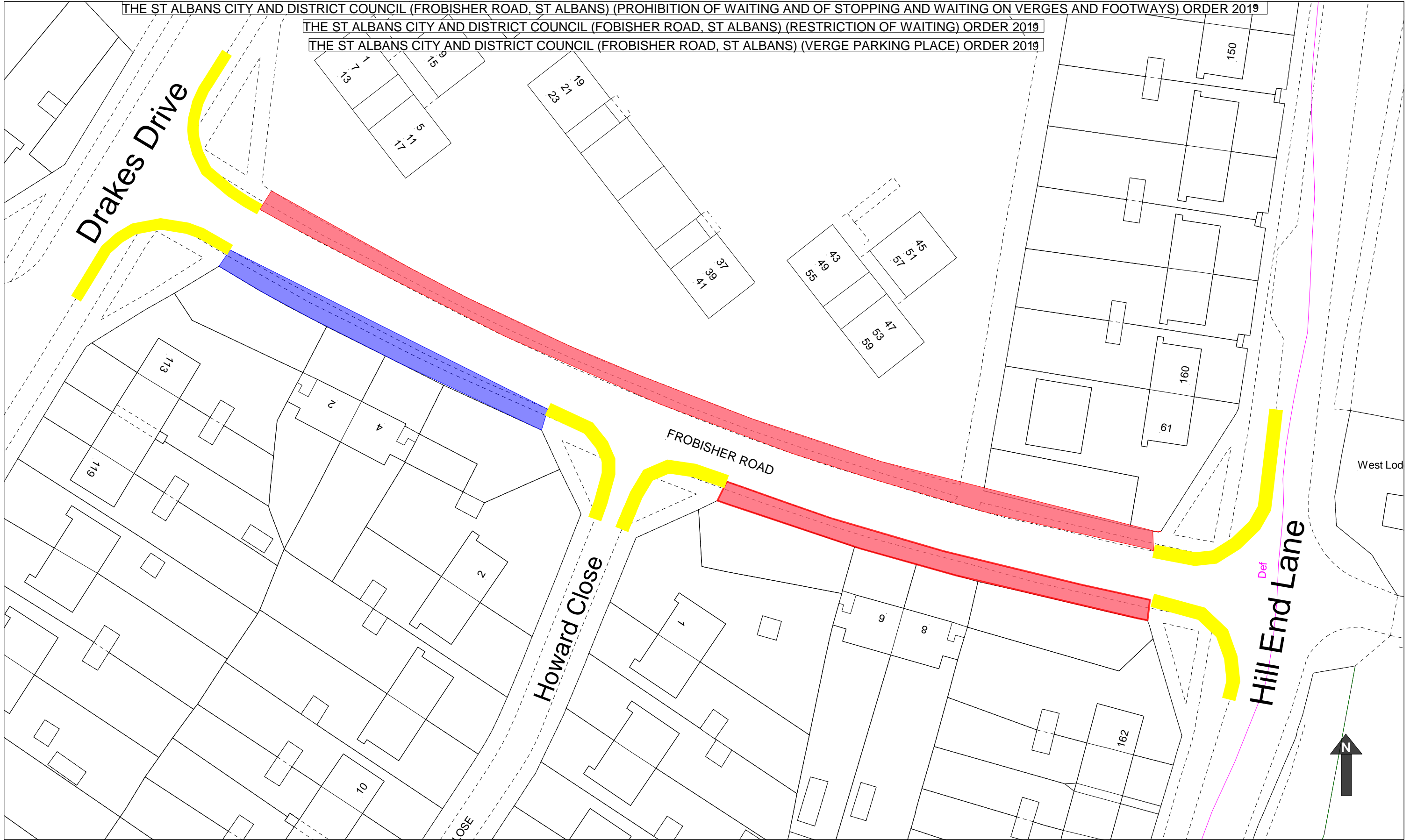
