Background

The Council is committed to improving road safety and traffic movement through various parking restrictions. To help with this commitment, the Council carries out an annual Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) process which only includes waiting restrictions. This scheme and proposed TRO includes various locations across various wards because of complaints from residents, Councillors, or other complainants.

Locations affected under this scheme are:

Restriction type; No waiting at any time (double yellow lines)

Baulk Close, Harpenden Dickinsons Field, Cravells Road, Harpenden Roundwood Park, Harpenden

Chester Gibbon Green and High Street, London Colney Manor Road. Bowmans Green Primary School, London Colney

Burydell Lane, Park Street
The Park, Redbourn
Church Street and High Street, Wheathampstead

Roland Street, St Albans Beaumont Avenue, St Albans Chiltern Road, St Albans Midway and Watford Road, St Albans Ernie Close, Mayne Avenue, St Albans



Benefits of the Proposals
