### 2. The Land To Which The Notice Relates

16 Roundwood Gardens, Harpenden, Hertfordshire Shown edged red on the attached plan.

# 3. The Matters Which Appear To Constitute The Breach Of Planning Control

It appears to the Council that the following breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.

Erection of tree house structure and raised platform.

## 4. Reasons For Issuing This Notice

The tree house by reason of its size, location and design creates significant overlooking to the detriment of residential amenity to properties in Park Rise contrary to policies 69 and 72 of the St Albans Local Plan Review 1994.

### 5. What You Are Required To Do

Remove the tree house structure and raised platform from the land and make good the land.

### 6. Time For Compliance

Two months after this notice takes effect.

#### 7. When This Notice Takes Effect

This notice takes effect on 22 September 2010 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.


### **ANNEX**

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in paragraph 6 of the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
