ENFORCEMENT NOTICE OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

1. This Notice is issued by the council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. The Land To Which The Notice Relates

90 Sandridge Road St.Albans Hertfordshire Shown edged red on the attached plan.

3. The Matters Which Appear To Constitute The Breach Of Planning Control

It appears to the Council that the following breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.

Without planning permission the unauthorised erection of a single storey mono pitched timber extension at the rear of the property (shown marked blue on the attached plan.)

4. Reasons For Issuing This Notice

The site is located within the St.Albans Conservation Area. The National Planning Policy Framework makes a clear distinction that the planning process should protect and enhance the local environment, especially preserving the built and natural heritage whilst reconciling the need for economic growth.

The single storey mono pitched structure attached to the rear of the extension fails to leave the original building form predominant, and together with its roof form and temporary appearance fails to preserve or enhance the character and appearance of the Conservation Area and is therefore contrary to Policies 69 (General Design and Layout) and 85 (Development in Conservation Areas) of the St. Albans District Local Plan Review 1994 and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. What You Are Required To Do

Remove the single storey mono pitched timber structure and make good any damaged brickwork in matching materials.

6. Time For Compliance

3 months after this notice takes effect.

7. When This Notice Takes Effect

This notice takes effect on 11 April 2013 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.


ANNEX
