1. This Notice is issued by the council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. The Land To Which The Notice Relates

Land a 162 –164 Radlett Road Frogmore St.Albans Hertfordshire. Shown edged red on the attached plan.

3. The Matters Which Appear To Constitute The Breach Of Planning Control

It appears to the Council that the following breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.

Without planning permission the increase in height of roof of outbuilding (shown shaded pink on the attached plan).

4. Reasons For Issuing This Notice

By reason of the increase in height, scale and volume, it is considered that the current roof is a disproportionate addition over and above the size of the original building and is therefore inappropriate development in the Green Belt. The building also leads to a loss of openness of the Green Belt. The development is therefore inappropriate and contrary to Policies 1 (Metropolitan Green Belt) and 13 (Extensions of dwellings in the Green Belt) of the St.Albans District Local Plan Review 1994 and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework (March 2012).

5. What You Are Required To Do

Remove the dual pitched roof entirely from the building and re-roof to form a flat roof single storey building not exceeding 2.5 metres in height.

6. Time For Compliance

3 months after this notice takes effect.

7. When This Notice Takes Effect

This notice takes effect on 13 January 2014 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
